FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). www.FederalStudentAid.ed.gov.

Beginning January 2, students heading to college the following fall can submit their FAFSA for financial awards and low-cost loans. With \$144 billion available, early applicants have the best chances of getting the most money for college. Students are encouraged to use the online method for filing the FAFSA. The publication *Funding Education Beyond High School* is available online at www.federalstudentaid.ed.gov/guide in both html and PDF. This publication provides comprehensive detail about the federal student aid programs. Information is also available in Spanish.

Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG)

Eligibility: Be a first or second-year undergraduate student or a student in a certificate program of a least one year in a degree program at a two-year or four-year degree-granting institution..

Criteria: Be a Pell Grant recipient. Have completed a rigorous secondary school program of study. If you are completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online (www.fafsa.ed.gov), FAFSA on the Web will predetermine if you are eligible to answer the ACG questions.

High School University Program (HSUP)

HSUP is for motivated, well-qualified high school students who anticipate enrolling at the University of Utah. Students in the program are generating a University transcript while enrolled in high school; completed courses are applied toward University credit. Students are eligible to take any classes being offered for which they meet the prerequisites. No online/telecourses or University Honors courses are permitted. They also receive an approximate 30 percent tuition reduction. Financial assistance (financial aid/scholarships) is *not available* to students participating in HUSP. *This program must be coordinated through the student's high school counselor.* Students who wish to participate in HSUP during the summer semester 2010 must submit their application and supporting materials by May 1. The deadline for fall semester is August 1.

Weber State University "Dream Weber" Free Tuition Program

Eligibility: Annual household income is \$25,000 or less. Enroll as an undergraduate freshman, transfer, returning or continuing student.

Hill Air Force Base Officers' Spouses' Club Scholarship Program

Eligibility: Applicants must meet ALL of the following criteria:

 - i. An unmarried, legal dependent of active duty, activated guard/reserve, active duty retired, missing-in-action, deceased active duty or deceased retired military members of any branch of service OR

Eligibility: High school graduates or home schooled students that have been accepted to and accredited institution of higher education within the current year or received a recognized equivalent of a high school diploma (GED).

Criteria: Minimum ACT composite score of 25; Minimum GPA of 3.7; proof of U.S. citizenship and Utah residency. Applications are in the Career Center or at www.schools.ut.gov/curr/Early_College/Byrd.

Award: Up to \$1,500 per year from one to four years or \$6,000.

Deadline: **March 26**

T.H. Bell Teaching Incentive Loan Program

Eligibility: High school seniors or any junior who will have completed the requirements for an Early Graduation Program. College students who have declared education as their major and completed 24 semester credits or more, may also apply through the university education department.

3.5 years of Social Science
3 years of a lab based natural Science (one each of biology, chemistry and physics)
2 years of the same Foreign Language
Those seniors who did not apply for the Regents' Scholarship or have an incomplete Regents' Scholarship file, but desire recognition as a Utah Scholar should complete an application form, submit an official high school transcript and a college transcript if you have earned college credit from a CE course (even if the course is on your high school transcript). Students who have already submitted a completed application for the Regents' Scholarship have also applied to be recognized as a Utah Scholar and do not need to apply again.
