REMINDER TO SENIORS: The FAFSA application is open on October 1, 2022. You will need to fill this out even if you don't qualify for a grant. Colleges require this to be done in order to be eligible for scholarships. There are other scholarships that require this to be filled out.

It can even sometimes extend to the grandchildren of former or deceased military members. If you have a parent or grandparent who served or is serving in the U.S. Military, then selecting the Military Affiliation box on your profile will qualify you for these scholarship opportunities.

All: Going Merry is where you can find and apply for scholarships, sign up for Going Merry (<https://www.goingmerry.com>) -- it's free! Going Merry has thousands of national, regional, and local scholarships. There are also opportunities for every grade level, from freshmen to seniors.

Here are some reasons Going Merry is worth looking at:

Scholarship bundles: You can apply to multiple scholarships using one application and the same essay prompt.

Vetted scholarships: The Going Merry team periodically reviews every scholarship listing, to ensure the scholarship program is still active and the information is correct.

Personal matching: Once signed up, you'll answer a few questions to fill out a basic profile, and then get matched to scholarships that fit your background, academics, interests, etc.

Clear organization: You can shortlist favorites and get deadline reminders about them. All drafts and applications are saved, and you'll get updates on the scholarships you've applied to.

Direct, auto-filled applications: You can apply to many scholarships directly on the site (with forms helpfully pre-filled).

Financial aid applications: Seniors can also submit the FAFSA® through Going Merry, using their more user-friendly version of the government form, which they call "the FAFSA® Made Easier."

***ALL: ZIONS BANK® PAYS FOR A'S.**

Hardworking middle school, junior high, and high school students (ages 12 to 18) in Utah and Idaho are paid up to \$1 per "A" on their 2021-2022 report cards. (Sorry, "A-" grades aren't eligible.) They're also entered for a chance to win scholarship savings accounts. They give away 36 awards of \$500 each and two \$1,000 accounts each school year.

How to Get Started

1. Students should bring their most recent report card for the 2021-2022 school year and a parent or guardian to any [branch](#).

2. For every "A," they'll get \$1 deposited into a [Young Savers Account](#). If they don't have an account or aren't a Zions Bank® client, they'll still be rewarded .50 cents per "A."
 3. Getting paid for an "A" enters the student for the chance to win a scholarship savings account in a drawing. The student's name, grade, phone number, school name and city must be provided to be entered. **Community drawings:** 36 students from different geographic regions in Utah and Idaho will win scholarship savings accounts worth \$500 throughout the school year. Drawing deadlines to submit most current report cards are shown below.
- 1st Semester Report Card Drawing Deadline: **Feb 28, 2023**
 - 2nd Semester Report Card Drawing Deadline: **Jul 31, 2023**
 - **Year-end grand prize drawing:** Eligible entries from all community drawings will be pooled into the grand prize drawing.

One Utah student and one Idaho student will each win a grand prize \$1,000 scholarship savings account. The deadline to turn in final report cards for the year-end drawing is **July 31, 2023**. Find complete contest details and all drawing deadlines below.
